This is with reference to above mentioned subject regarding extension of provisional approval of affiliation to **Department of Law, Shobhit University, Gangoh, Uttar Pradesh** which has already applied for extension of approval of affiliation for the academic year 2023-2024.

This is to bring to your kind knowledge that the following resolution was passed on 09th June, 2023 by the General Council of the Bar Council of India with respect to grant of provisional approval of affiliation for academic year 2023-2024 for those centers of Legal Education which have applied for approval of affiliation for the academic year 2023-2024.

“RESOLVED that with respect to existing Centers of Legal Education/colleges, whose inspection fee has been deposited, application for extension of approval of affiliation is pending, no inspection could be done or the inspection has been done, but inspection report could not be placed before the Legal Education Committee or the Standing Committee for its consideration, such Centers of Legal Education/colleges may continue to admit students only for the academic year 2023-2024. This will apply only in case where affiliation has been granted by the University. Such provisional approval shall be subject to any decision taken after the inspection of the CLE is done by the Bar Council of India subsequently

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**It shall further be conditional and is subject to compliance as per circular dated 05.02.2020 bearing No.BCI:D:158 (LE:Circulation No.01/2020), issued to all Centers of Legal education, as per the extended time of such compliance, whereby every center of Legal Education/college is required to submit a certified authenticated bank statement bearing bank stamp, date and signature, mandatorily with respect to the salary/ies being disbursed to all the teachers/faculties every three months with effect from March, 2022 on a regular basis, unless specifically sought at other intervals, and also furnish list of teachers with qualifications as per BCI and UGC Rules, and further furnish proof/receipts of fulfillment of minimum library requirements, as enumerated under Schedule-III, Rule-15, Minimum Library requirements of Legal Education Rules-which is the sine qua non of a Center of Legal Education. Certain show cause notices and compliance letters had also been issued specifically to certain Centers of Legal Education/Colleges, with conditions mentioned therein, which have to be complied too as per the time stipulations therein, and if they have not been complied with they must be complied with immediately.**

**An affidavit/undertaking to comply with the conditions mentioned in the above referred circular and of all the rules of Legal Education, shall be required to be submitted by way of duly notarized affidavit within 15 days of receipt of this letter by way of hardcopy and also by way of scanned copy at [complianceaffiliationle2@gmail.com](mailto:complianceaffiliationle2@gmail.com) with heading-COMPLIANCE TO PROVISIONAL APPROVAL-REQUIREMENTS**

**It is made clear that if any Center of Legal Education, fails to submit all the required documents as sought by way of the afore referred circular and the show cause notices (where applicable), and the compliance letters, already issued, then their application for extension of approval for 2023-2024 shall not be considered and, if, approval is granted for the academic session 2023-2024, it may be withdrawn.**

You may kindly bear in mind that the Bar Council of India is the sole and supreme sanctioning authority for seats and as a general rule it does not allow any supernumerary quota of seats for law degree courses, over and above the sanctioned strength of seats and whatever reservation of seats is to be done by the University as a general rule has to be done within sanctioned strength of seats.

The Center/s of Legal Education/College may take a note of the above mentioned facts and furnish compliance of the same and of the other rules and regulations of Legal Education, including the stipulations specified in the abovesaid referred circular/s, show cause notices and compliance letters, and in ANNEXURE-A, attached to this provisional approval of affiliation letter, which is required to be complied with adequate documentary proof and by way of a notarized affidavit, immediately if the same has not already been complied with, failing which, their application for extension of approval for 2023-24 shall not be considered and if approval, is granted for the academic session 2023-2024, the same may be withdrawn too."

The last date for compliance of the above referred circular has expired on 31st August 2022, as it was extended from time to time due to the pandemic. Therefore ensure to comply with the same, otherwise the provisional approval of affiliation being issued herewith may be withdrawn.

**Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst.ID AYU0336) with 100 seats for UG (BAMS) Course and 6 PG courses with 28 seats (instead of 36 seats) in 06 subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, (iii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats, (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 05 seats (instead of 6 seats), (v) Rachana Sharir - 02 seats (instead of 6 seats) & (vi) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 03 seats (instead of 6 seats) for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.**

**Sir/Madam,**

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **to Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst.ID AYU0336)** inspection of your College was conducted on **22.05.2023 & 23.05.2023 on hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) & 36 Seats in 06 PG Courses namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats, (ii) Rachana Sharir - 06 seats, (iii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (vi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. Further, seven faculties i.e. **Dr. Mujjiga Mahendar (AYST00621), Dr. Bharti B Asangihal (AYRB01090), Dr. Ravindra Balasaheb Gunjal (AYPS00921), Dr. Prasad Uba (AYKC00517), Dr. Manju Kumari (AYPS00933), Dr. Akshay Vij (AYST00945) and Dr. Prerana Rani (AYKC00514)** of your institution in the academic year 2022-23 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3 (1) (f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitiation dated 31/8/2021 and letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023, dated 21.08.2023, **a penalty of rupees 1.75 crore** was imposed on your institution in respect of appointment of physically absent but present only on paer teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023 dated 21.08.2023.
4. Further, an appeal vide ref. no. KSVAMC/SUG/199/2023 dated 26.08.2023 was received in Commission from Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh against imposition of penalty of Rs 1.75 crore by MARBISM, inrespect of appointing physically absent but present only on paper teachers. Accordingly, a letter was sent to you, vide Commission's letter dated 12.09.2023 to appear before the designated hearing committee on dated 14.09.2023 in respect of appeal filed by you. Hearing of faculties was conducted on 14.09.2023. In this regard all the evidences provided by you and faculties have been reverified by the designated hearing committee members and hearing

committee observed that your college has filed a compliant and matter is under enquiry/investigation so that further action shall depend on the outcome of enquiry/investigation. Hence the hearing committee recommend to consider the appeal by Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, for the academic session 2023-24.

5. The recommendation of hearing committee was placed before Chairperson, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine and it has been decided by the Chairperson, NCISM to approve the decision of hearing committee and to consider the appeal. The Chairperson directed President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board to consider the appeal filed by Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area, Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, for the academic session 2023-24.
6. Therefore, it was decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to consider the appeal and further, the assessment report was placed in the **58<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **14.09.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 14.09.2023 to appear on 16.09.2023, before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to the college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) & 36 Seats in 06 PG Courses namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant – 06 seats, (ii) Rachana Sharir – 06 seats, (iii) Kriya Sharir – 06 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (vi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the academic year 2023-24.** The applicant college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter ref no. KSVAMC/SUG/226/23, dated 15.09.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
7. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Shailendra Bhardwaj Principal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **16.09.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

We have meticulously followed the provisions laid out in both MSR 2016 and the NCISM Act 2020. However, we wish to address certain concerns related to your previous letter, which seemingly contradicts the gazette notification of MSR 2016 and the NCISM Act 2020. Furthermore, according to clause (56) of the NCISM Act, any regulations passed by an autonomous Board as an executive order are not deemed valid unless they have been vetted by the Legal Department and duly notified or amended through a gazette notification. The faculty of our esteemed college have always upheld the values and standards of education. Above all, it is respectfully again submitted that non-availability of specific records should not automatically classify faculty as non-regular members. The mandate to retain 06 months of CCTV Camera footage and Google timeline for faculty members, as well as the mandates for changing details on Aadhar Card, Voter-ID, Driving License, and Passport etc, encroaches upon their fundamental rights to privacy. This stance is corroborated by the landmark judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Justice Mr. K.S. Puttaswamy case of 2017 (10 SSC 1). It is worth noting that for Government and Government-funded institutions, no parallel directive is in existence, highlighting a concerning disparity in the approach. Sir, the imposition of demands not aligned with the law or those that potentially brush		Dr. ShailendraBharadwaj, Principal and Mr. ArifNaseer, Nodal Officer represented the college.  The College has submitted a list of total 50 faculty members. Five among them were on paper teachers as per the letter dated 21.8.2023. The college authorities submitted that they are contemplating for appeal.  Therefore as of date only, the college have only 45 eligible teachers.  After excluding the 5 excess teachers the college have 40 eligible teachers including 19 HF across 14 departments for 100 UG seats  The college authorities submitted that they are eligible for 6 PG seats each in 5 departments. against the boundaries of citizens' fundamental privacy rights could undermine the respected standing of our Honorable Ministry. Such actions seem inconsistent with the core principles of national integration and India's sovereignty - values our nation deeply cherishes.

With respect, we wish to state that for extension of our approval for an intake capacity of 100 UG (BAMS) seats & 36 Seats in 06 PG Courses namely (1) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats (2) Rachana Sharir - 06 seats (3) KriyaSharir - 06 seats (4) Prasuti and StriRoga- 06 seats (5) kayachikitsa-06 seats (6) Shalya tantra-06 seats for session 2023-24 visitation was done on **09-10 May 2023** by a well-appointed team of experts.

Surprisingly based on some alleged anonymous complaints, without any locus standi, an online hearing was conducted on **26-27 June 2023**. Even after that again a surprise visitation was done on **19-20 July 2023** by a team of experts appointed by NCISM. The basis for the action appears to be an alleged anonymous complaint, a premise that has raised legitimate questions about fairness and due process. Considering the same, with utmost respect for due process, we have reached out to the local police authorities, presenting a First Information Report (FIR) against the anonymous complainer for defaming the college with mala fide intentions. Our action is purely to seek clarity and ensure the continued trust and integrity associated with our college.

9. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed **in the 59<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **on 18.09.2023**. Board verified the same and decided that the college is fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 100 seats for UG (BAMS) Course and 3 PG courses i.e. (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (ii)**

**Shalya Tantra-06 seats & (iii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 for the academic session 2023-24, but not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for 03 PG Courses namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats, (ii) Rachana Sharir - 06 seats & (iii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 06 seats from the academic session 2023-24. Hence the Board decided to issue Conditional Permission for existing UG (BAMS) course and 3 PG courses i.e. (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats & (iii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats and for remaining 03 PG courses as per seat reduction policy for the academic session 2023-24.**

10. Further, as per regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor. The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience.

Accordingly, as per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the **59<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of MARBISM, college is not fulfilling the required teacher student ratio in the following department for PG:-

- (1) **Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhant-** 01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor and 03 Assistant Professor (01 Consent) without minimum 05 years teaching experience are available. Hence fulfilling for 05 seats instead of 06 seats.
- (2) **Rachana Sharir-** 01 Associate Professor and 02 Assistant Professor without minimum 05 years teaching experience are available. Hence fulfilling for 02 seats instead of 06 seats.
- (3) **Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga-** 01 Professor, and 01 Assistant Professor without minimum 05 years teaching experience are available. Hence fulfilling for 03 seats instead of 06 seats.

Hence, after applying the regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for **03 PG courses with 10 seats (instead of 18 seats) in the subjects namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 05 seats (instead of 06 seats), (ii) Rachana Sharir - 02 seats (instead of 06 seats) & (iii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 03 seats (instead of 06 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.**

11. Therefore, **Conditional Permission is issued to Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Center at Shobhit University, Adarsh Institutional Area Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst.ID AYU0336) with 100 seats for UG (BAMS) Course and 6 PG courses with 28 seats (instead of 36 seats) in 06 subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, (ii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, (iii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats, (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 05 seats (instead of 6 seats), (v) Rachana Sharir - 02 seats (instead of 6 seats) & (vi) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga- 03 seats (instead of 6 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the academic session 2023-24** subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements:-

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **100 seats and** minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **28 seats (instead of 36 seats) in 06 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

12. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
13. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.**
14. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
15. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academicsession 2024-25:**

- i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - iii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG Courses.
  - iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
16. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2024-25.
17. The above said permission to the college shall be subjected to final outcome of enquiry/investigation.
18. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.

- (i) The institution shall comply with various other norms and standards prescribed in the NCTE regulations, as amended from time to time. The Institution shall fulfil the revised Norms relating to infrastructure, instructional facilities, enhanced amount of Endowment and Reserve Fund, Number and qualifications of Teaching Staff, Curriculum and implementation strategies in view of the change in duration/intake of programme(s) offered in the institution within the time limit allowed by NCTE.
- (ii) The institution shall make admission only after it obtains affiliation from the examining body in terms of clause 8(10) of the NCTE (Recognition Norms & Procedure) Regulations, 2014.
- (iii) The institution shall comply with the condition as laid down in the clause 8(3) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 which provided that "An institution which has been recognized by the Council shall obtain accreditation from an accrediting agency approved by Council within five year of such recognition."
- (iv) The institution shall ensure that the required number of academic staff for conducting the course is always in position.
- (v) As per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 the following norms have been prescribed for staff/ qualifications/administrative and professional staff/terms and conditions of service etc.

**NORMS AND STANDARDS FOR BACHELOR OF EDUCATION PROGRAMME LEADING TO THE BACHELOR OF EDUCATION (B.ED.) DEGREE – Regarding Staff**

**5.1 Academic Faculty**

For an intake of two basic units of 50 students each, that is total students strength of 200, there shall 16 full-time faculty members.

The distribution of faculty across different curricular areas shall be as under:

31.	Principal / HoD	One
32.	Perspectives in Education	Four
33.	Pedagogy subjects (Maths, Science, Social Science, Language)	Eight
34.	Health and Physical Education	One
35.	Fine Arts	One
36.	Performing Arts (Music/Dance/Theatre)	One

- Note: (i) The faculty positions listed under different subject categories may teach course(s) in the Teacher Education Programme across curricular areas specified, and can cater to both foundation and pedagogy course(s). If the students strength for two years is one hundred (with one basic unit) only, the number of faculty shall be reduced to 8.
- (ii) Faculty can be utilized teaching in flexible manner so as to optimize academic expertise available.

**5.2 Qualifications**

The faculty shall possess the following qualifications:

- A. Principal / HOD
- (i) Postgraduate degree in Arts / Sciences / Social Sciences / Humanities/Commerce with minimum 55% marks; and
  - (ii) M.Ed. with minimum 55% marks; and
  - (iii) Ph.D in Education or in any pedagogic subject offered in the institutions; and
  - (iv) Eight years of teaching experience in a secondary Teacher Education Institution.
- Desirable : Diploma/Degree in Education Administration or Educational Leadership.
- B. Perspectives in Education or Foundation Courses
- (i) Postgraduate degree in Social Sciences with minimum 55% marks; and
  - (ii) M.Ed. degree from a recognized university with minimum 55% marks.
- OR
- (i) Postgraduate (MA) degree in Education with minimum 55% marks; and
  - (ii) B.Ed./B.El.Ed. degree with minimum 55% marks.
- C. Curriculum and Pedagogic Courses
- (i) Postgraduate degree in Sciences / Mathematics /Social Sciences/Languages with minimum 55% marks; and
  - (ii) M.Ed. degree minimum 55% marks

**Desirable :** PhD degree in Education with subject specialisations.

[Note: In case of B and C put together, for two faculty positions, a postgraduate degree in Sociology/Psychology/Philosophy with 55% marks, and B.Ed. /B.El.Ed. with 55% marks and three years of teaching experience in a secondary school shall be considered].

- D. Specialised Courses Physical Education  
 (i) Master of Physical Education (M.P.Ed.) with minimum 55% marks. (Training/qualification in yoga education shall be desirable)
- Visual Arts  
 (i) Post graduate degree in Fine Arts (MFA) with minimum 55% marks
- Performing Arts.  
 (viii) Post graduate degree in Music/Dance/Theatre Arts with minimum 55% marks.

5.3 **Administrative and Professional Staff**

(a) Librarian (B.Lib. with 55% marks)	One
(b) Lab Assistant (BCA with 55% marks)	One

**Qualifications**

As prescribed by State Government /UT Administration Concerned.

Note : In a composite institution, the Principal and academic, administrative and technical staff can be shared. There shall be one Principal, and others may be termed as HoDs.

**5.4 Terms and conditions Service**

The terms and conditions of service of teaching and non-teaching staff including selection procedure, pay scales, age of superannuation and other benefits shall be as per the policy of the State Government/Affiliating body.

The institutions shall adhere to the fulfillment of the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 and ensure the following before commencement of the session:-

- (a) The institution which have submitted reply to Letter of Intent and appointed staff as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2009 with the approval of the affiliating body shall be required to modify/replace the required faculty as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The institution shall be required to submit the compliance report before the commencement of the session 2015-16.
- (b) As per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 an institution is allowed/permitted to take two units at a time of a teacher education programme. Accordingly, the faculty requirements have been laid down for two units of the programme in the Regulations 2014 i.e. for 200 students in the first and the second year. However, those institutions whose applications are pending if opt for one unit i.e. 100 students in the first and second year, the requirement of faculty shall be reduced to eight out of which five lecturers i.e. one each for Science, Social Studies, Mathematics and two for Languages and one Health and Physical Education lecturer and one Performing/Visual Art Lecturer, and one Principal or Head of the Department shall be appointed. One of the lecturers may possess post graduation degree in Psychology/Philosophy/Sociology if the Principal/Head of the Department possesses PG degree in one of the school subjects
- (b) The institutions having applied for D.El.Ed. course are being granted recognition for one unit only, as the application made by the institution was for an intake of 50 students.
- (vi) The institutions whose applications were pending with the Regional offices before 1.12.2014 (the date of notification of Regulations, 2014), shall be considered for recognition as standalone institutions but they shall move gradually to become a composite institution but not later than 2016-17.
- (vii) As per the guidelines issued by the NCTE Hq vide letter No. 51-4/2014/NCTE/N&S dated 24th December, 2014 the institutions shall be required to fulfil the requirement of additional staff, infrastructure by 31st October, 2015 in case recognition has been granted for two units of B.Ed. course. However in respect of B.Ed. programme, under new Regulations, 2014, there is a change in basic unit size and required infrastructure, staff pattern etc., the NRC shall cause inspection of the institution by 29 Feb., 2016 for ascertaining the fulfilment of infrastructure facilities. If the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the permission given for one basic unit out of two basic units shall be withdrawn.

4. Further, the recognition is subject to fulfilment of all such other requirements as may be prescribed by other regulatory bodies like UGC, affiliating University/ Body, the State Government etc. as applicable. The affiliating body (University/State Govt.) shall also required to verify the authenticity of the land & building documents as well as appointment of requisite teaching & non-teaching staff as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 by the concerned institution before grant of affiliation to an institution.

5. The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee a Self-Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along the statement of annual accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant.


6. The institution shall maintain & update its Web-site as per provisions of NCTE Regulations and always display following as mandatory disclosure:-

- (i) Copy of the Application Form
- (ii) Land and Building Particulars
- (iii) Staff Profile
- (iv) Recognition letter
- (v) Information for having fulfilled the norms & standard and other required conditions.

7. In case if the land is in the name of the Society/trust, the land is to be transferred within six months in the name of the institution, failing which action shall be initiated to withdraw the recognition. It shall be essential on the part of the institution concerned to get the needful done in this regard and intimate about the same to the respective Regional Committee along with the new land documents within the stipulated time.

8. If the institution contravenes any of the above conditions or the provisions of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and Orders made or issued there under, the Regional Committee shall withdraw the recognition as under the provisions of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act.


